NUCLEUS BEEHIVES: WHAT AM I BUYING (OR SELLING)?

A nucleus beehive (or "nuc") is basically a smaller version of a full-sized established hive, containing the <u>nucleus</u> or core of what would enable the nuc to grow steadily during spring and summer. For a 5-frame nuc, the contents recommended to enable successful hive growth include:

- A laying queen (preferably one that's already been accepted by her nestmates)
- 2. Drawn comb in most (if not all) frames
- 3. Brood of all stages in an amount that would cover the combs of the equivalent of at least two deep (8 1/2" x 16 3/4" wax) frames
- 4. The equivalent of two deep frames of food (pollen and honey)
- 5. Pest levels <u>NOT exceeding</u> recommended thresholds* (small hive beetles and varroa mites in particular)
- 6. No evidence of bacterial disease
- 7. Enough adult bees to cover the equivalent of at least four deep frames Variations from these contents would typically be reflected in price adjustments.
